Unit class (I2) of Assenagon I Multi Asset Balanced (the "Fund"), sub-fund of the Assenagon I umbrella fund.

The Fund, established as a UCITS fund, is managed by **Assenagon Asset Management S.A.** (the "management company") and is authorised and regulated in Luxembourg by the Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier (CSSF). What is this product?

Type: It is a UCITS fund established in Luxembourg.

Term: The Fund has an indefinite term. With regard to the possibility of redemptions and the frequency of redemptions, please refer to the section "How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early".

Objectives: The Fund aims to generate capital growth through flexible investment across different asset classes. The Fund is actively managed without investments being limited to a specific benchmark universe. All income remains in the Fund and increases the value of the units. The sub-fund promotes environmental and social characteristics. In order to achieve its investment objective, the Fund pursues a multi-asset approach. This means that Portfolio Management has access to a broad range of asset classes from which particularly attractive investments can be selected. The integration of ESG criteria and the consideration of sustainability risks in the investment process are intended not only to meet the requirements of sustainable investing, but also to improve the ESG characteristics of the overall portfolio. Possible asset classes include international equity, bond, credit, money, commodity, currency, and volatility markets. The Fund may also invest in strategies whose investment objectives have the lowest possible correlation with developments in the traditional capital markets. The Fund may invest globally, both in euros and in other currencies. The Fund invests more than 25% in equities and similar equity interests or target funds with equities and similar equity interests. Equity investments can be hedged through derivatives. The proportion of equities and equity funds should not exceed 65% of the Fund's assets. In addition, other types of target funds, bonds, and debt securities are used. These also include debt securities that replicate the performance of commodities. Direct investments in debt securities must have a minimum rating of B- by Standard & Poor's or Fitch, or B3 by Moody's, or an equivalent rating. The Fund also uses derivatives both for investment and hedging purposes. The instruments used include, among others, futures, options, and swaps. If the currency of a unit class differs from the Fund's currency, the Fund employs foreign exchange derivatives to compensate the exchange rate risk between unit class currency and fund currency. Within the framework of the investment policy, Portfolio Management may use other permitted investment instruments. The use of derivatives can create a leverage effect in the Fund. The fund's currency is EUR. The Fund's custodian bank is European Depository Bank SA. Intended retail investor: The Fund is primarily aimed at wealthy retail investors, professional investors and eligible counterparties with basic knowledge and experience in the Fund's underlying asset classes and who pursue the goal of wealth formation. Investors should consider the tax regulation of the State of Luxembourg.

Which are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator

What happens if Assenagon Asset Management S.A. is unable to pay out?

The insolvency of the management company has no direct impact on your payout, as the legal provision specifies that in the event of the insolvency of the management company, the Fund does not become part of the insolvency estate, but remains independent.

What are the costs?

Cost over time

How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?

Recommended holding period: 3 years

This product is suitable for long-term investments. Fund units can be redeemed on each valuation date. There are no costs or fees for redemptions. Fund units can be redeemed on each valuation date. The management company can suspend the redemption of units if this is necessary due to exceptional circumstances, taking investor interests into account. To manage liquidity, measures such as anti-dilution levies and extended redemption notice periods may be applied. The anti-dilution levies can be charged on redemptions, subscriptions and conversion transactions. While intended to protect the Fund and its investors, these measures may lead to reduced redemption proceeds, delayed access to capital and differences from the expected redemption price.
